#### Scope of the Survey

- I limited the study to book/audio courses because including computer-based courses would have expanded the breadth and increased the cost of the survey considerably.
- I did not use ESL or EFL materials because the target learners in my audience are English teachers who are putting themselves in the learner's shoes. Thus almost all of the materials examined are designed for English speakers.

### All-Audio Courses

- A lot of English commentary on the CD (taking the place of textbook explanations).
- > Some use a cognitive building-block approach while others are built on situational dialogues.
- > Hesitant to rely on audio alone (explanatory booklets or online transcripts and exercises).

### Audio Courses with Booklets

- Usually dialogue-based.
- Some are like audio phrasebooks.
- > Booklet tends to be a transcript.
- Some cultural notes.
- Difficult without background knowledge.
